

# CITY OF CAPE TOWN TRANSPORT INFORMATION FOR THE 2010 FIFA World Cup™



The City of Cape Town will offer visitors and residents safe and easily accessible public transport during the 2010 FIFA World Cup™ from 29 May to 16 July 2010. Rail, bus, minibus taxi and metered taxi services will cater for a wide variety of transport requirements, and will ensure that Cape Town Stadium in Green Point, the FIFA Fan Fest™ on the Grand Parade, as well as the public viewing areas (PVAs) at the Bellville Velodrome, OR Tambo Sports Hall in Khayelitsha, Swartklip Sports Hall in Mitchells Plain, and Vygieskraal Stadium in Athlone are adequately served.

Event-related public transport will be added to the regular public transport system. Existing rail, bus and minibus taxi will extend their services to cater for the increased demand around match times.

Different transport plans will apply to match and non-match days. Match days and times at Cape Town Stadium are as follows:

- Friday 11 June 2010 at 20:30 - Uruguay vs France
- Monday 14 June 2010 at 20:30 - Italy vs Paraguay
- Friday 18 June 2010 at 20:30 - England vs Algeria
- Monday 21 June 2010 at 13:30 - Portugal vs Korea DPR
- Thursday 24 June 2010 at 20:30 - Cameroon vs Netherlands
- Tuesday 29 June 2010 at 20:30 - Round of 16
- Saturday 3 July 2010 at 16:00 - Quarter Final
- Tuesday 6 July 2010 at 20:30 - Semi-Final

The comprehensive transport services that will be provided during the 2010 FIFA World Cup™ will all be accessible from or near the Civic Centre bus station in Hertzog Boulevard in the city centre, and from Cape Town Rail Station. These are within easy walking distance of each other.

The Golden Acre bus terminus, station deck minibus taxi rank, metered-taxi ranks, long-distance bus terminal, FIFA Fan Fest™ and the fan walk to Cape Town Stadium are also close by.

### BUS SERVICES OPERATING ON MATCH DAYS ONLY

A free shuttle bus service for match ticket holders will run from the Civic Centre bus station to Cape Town Stadium in Green Point (see Map D). This service will operate from six hours before kick-off, until four hours after the final whistle. Buses will depart every three to five minutes, depending on demand.

A free bus service will also operate from the park-and-ride facility on the University of Cape Town's Upper Campus in Rondebosch to the Civic Centre bus station. The hours of operation will be from four hours before kick-off until four after final whistle.

The Hout Bay service will run from Hout Bay to the Civic Centre bus station, along the Atlantic Seaboard via Camps Bay, Sea Point and Cape Town Stadium. It will operate from four hours before kick-off, until 02:00. A fare based service, the cost of the journey will be based on the distance travelled, as with the regular service, and buses will depart at regular intervals. It provides convenient access to the park-and-ride schemes at Kronendal Primary School sports field off Andrews Road in Hout Bay, and at Camps Bay High School sports field off Victoria Road in Maiden's Cove.

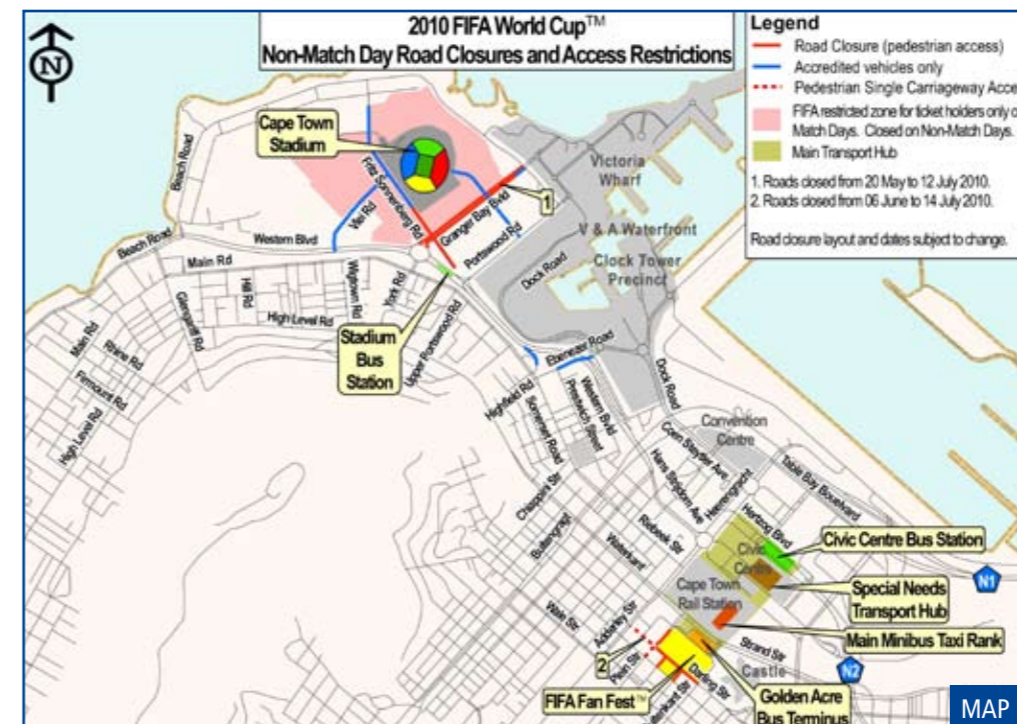
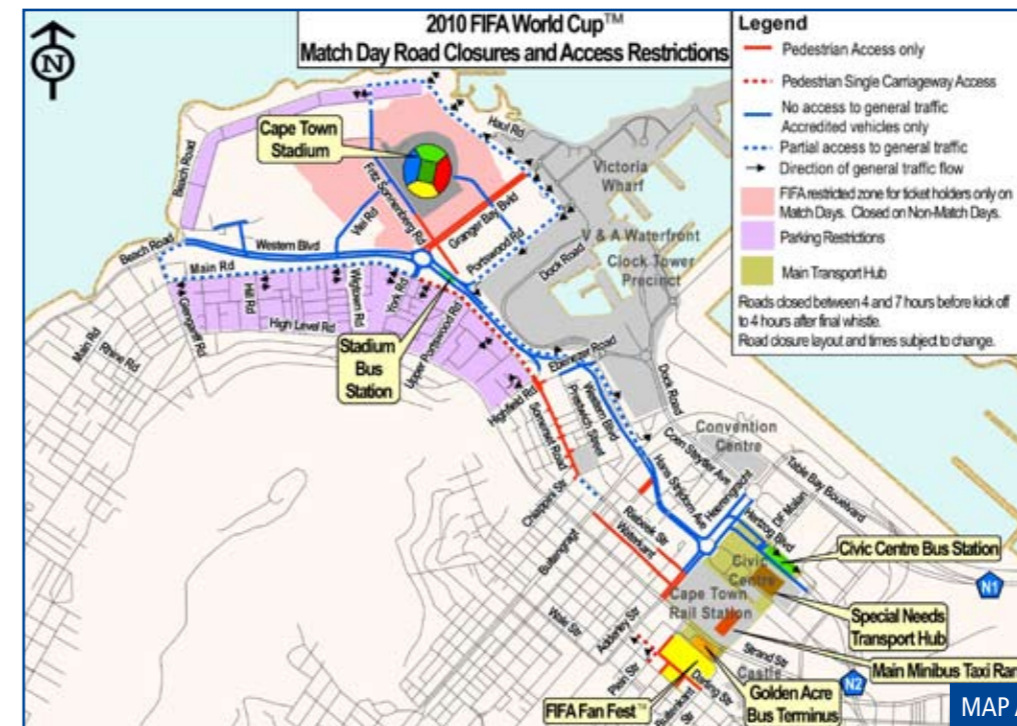
### BUS SERVICES OPERATING FOR THE DURATION OF THE EVENT

An airport-to-city service will run between the newly completed bus station at the Cape Town International Airport, via the N2 and Eastern Boulevard, to the Civic Centre bus station (see Map D). This service will operate 20 to 24 hours a day for the duration of the event, and will cost R50,00 one way. It will depart every six to 30 minutes, depending on demand.

The inner-city bus service, which will run 24 hours a day, will travel from the Civic Centre bus station, along DF Malan Street, Table Bay Boulevard, Heerengracht, Coen Steytler Avenue, Long Street and Loop Street, Buitensingel, Orange Street, Buitenkant Street, Darling Street, Oswald Pirow Street, and back to the Civic Centre bus station (see Map D). This route also provides convenient access to numerous inner-city hotels, accommodation nodes, restaurants, entertainment areas, parking areas, and places of interest. Each journey will cost R8,00, and buses will depart every 10 to 30 minutes.

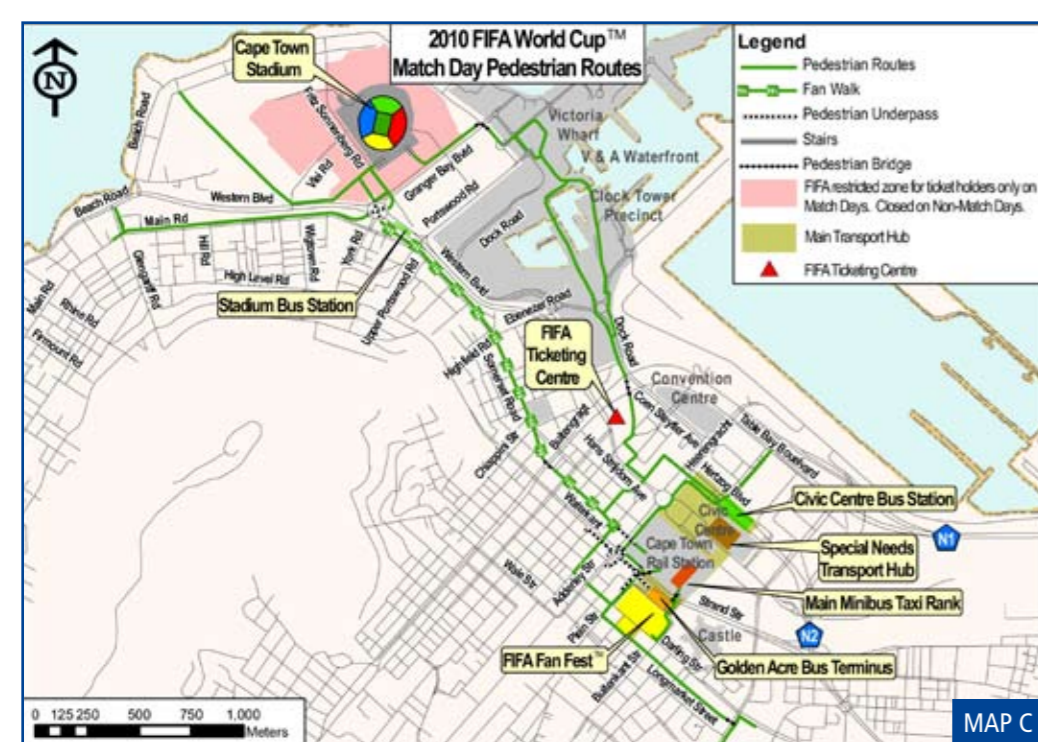
The Queen's Beach bus service travels between the Civic Centre bus station to Queen's Beach in Sea Point, via the Waterfront (see Map D). This service will operate until 02:00 daily for the duration of the World Cup event. The cost of the journey will be based on the distance travelled, and services will operate at regular intervals.

York Road will be closed with two-way traffic in the southern carriage way

- Sections of Bree, Long and Loop Street around Waterkant Street
- Beach Road from Fritz Sonnenberg Road to Granger Bay Boulevard will have one carriage way closed to traffic, with the northern carriage way accommodating two-way traffic. Only one-way traffic will be allowed from Granger Bay Boulevard Circle via Beach and Portwood Roads onto Western Boulevard to Buitengragt and into town

**DELIVERIES TO THE STADIUM**

During the event period, all deliveries to Cape Town Stadium will move through a logistics point ('log point', which will be operational from 5 June to 18 July, 8:00 - 20:00) and a remote search park (RSP, which will be operational from 22 May to 18 June), before being escorted to the stadium. Delivery vehicles will be accredited at the log point once the contents and intended destination of the load have been verified. From here, the vehicle will undergo a security check in the RSP, before being allowed to cross the security perimeter of the stadium. Unauthorised vehicles will be diverted at the log point.

**PORT ACCESS**

The port will be accessible throughout the event. However, operators should note the following:

- Access to the port through Dock Road will be restricted by the congestion and access control at the V&A Waterfront.
- The Heerengracht entrance to the port will remain open.
- The Oswald Pirow access to the port, along Table Bay Boulevard (N1), will be affected by the inflow of traffic related to the event.
- Duncan Road will not be open to general traffic. However, shuttle buses and coaches will use sections of this road to transport spectators to and from the passenger liners berthed in the Duncan Basin.
- The Marine Drive access to the port will remain open, but may be affected by higher than normal traffic flows.
- Freight vehicles should enter the port via the Marine Drive access, and exit via the Oswald Pirow access. Operators who usually approach the port along the N2 are advised to divert to the N1 earlier, and make use of the Marine Drive access.

**NON-MOTORISED TRANSPORT**

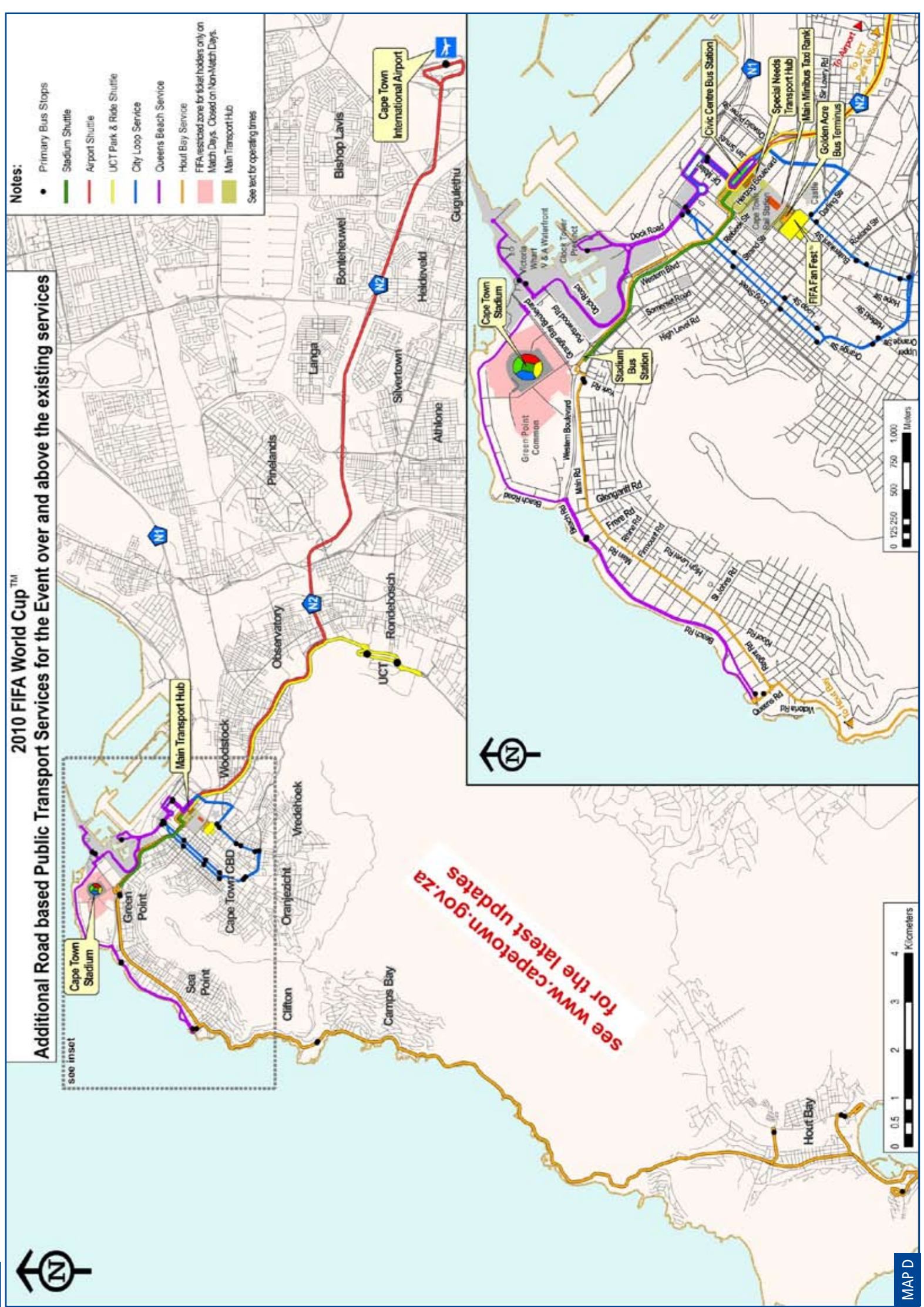
The Fan Walk route, covering a distance of 2,5 km, runs from Cape Town Station on Adderley Street, and the Grand Parade, along Waterkant Street, across the new pedestrian bridge at Buitengragt, along Somerset Road, to the stadium. The FIFA Fan Fest™, at the Grand Parade, is located approximately 100m from Cape Town Station off Strand Street.

Certain dedicated pedestrian and cycle routes along Somerset Road link the city centre to the stadium precinct. Various private dealerships will offer bicycles for rent, with lockup facilities provided around the stadium. However, cycling along the fan walk on match days is not advised during the peak period between four hours before kick-off, and two hours after the final whistle, due to the large volumes of pedestrians expected.

**OTHER PUBLIC TRANSPORT TO/FROM OUTSIDE THE METRO AREA**

Bus, rail and taxi services linking South Africa's towns and cities will operate as normal. They connect areas such as Stellenbosch, Paarl and Hermanus, as well as George and Port Elizabeth to Cape Town International Airport and Cape Town city centre. The cost of the journey is based on the distance travelled.

**RAIL PARK-AND-RIDE**

Cape Metrorail forms the backbone of the entire metropolitan transport system, serving 119 rail stations. It will operate until 02:00 daily for the duration of the World Cup event. Twenty Six rail stations have been selected as special stations for the World Cup. Located conveniently close to accommodation and covering the entire metropolitan area, these stations will be clearly signposted. They will also have event information, branding to make them easily identifiable and additional security to match the extended rail service times (see map E).

**PARKING**

There will be no general spectator parking available at the stadium or immediate surrounds, while parking in the city centre is also severely limited. All spectators are advised and encouraged to use the identified park-and-ride facilities outside the city centre, as indicated on Map E.

**PUBLIC TRANSPORT TO PUBLIC VIEWING AREAS (PVAS)**

The PVAs are well served by regular minibus public transport services that operate from ranks at nearby rail stations and public transport interchanges. The cost of the journey will depend on the distance travelled.

- Bellville Velodrome off Durban Road is linked to Bellville Station via minibus taxi services.
- The Vygieskraal Stadium in Athlone, off Klipfontein Road is accessible via Athlone Station.
- OR Tambo Sports Hall in Khayelitsha is located on Lansdowne Road, and within 500m of Nonqubela Station.
- Swartklip Sports Hall in Mitchells Plain is located on the corner of Spine Road and Mew Way, and within walking distance of Mitchells Plain Station and Town Centre.

**DISABILITIES**

Buses on the shuttle routes from the airport and to the stadium will be wheelchair friendly, as will be the Civic Centre bus station and the match day shuttle.

A special needs transport hub at the Civic Centre, between the Civic Centre bus station and Cape Town Station, will operate on all match days. This park-and-ride service to and from the stadium will be exclusively for people with disabilities, will only operate on match days and will be free of charge.
